As part of the enrollment process, each new leader must attend orientation with 4-H staff **prior to starting any project**. There are three steps to enrollment: 1) paperwork returned, 2) fingerprints cleared, and 3) orientation completed before any project meeting can be held by the leader. Each project meeting **MUST** have a leader and another adult (over 21) in attendance at all times. **To be sure we have adequate materials, please RSVP to the 4-H Office at 463-4495 with your name and your project(s).**

Update.... Eel River Cleanup

Hello Friends, Family, Helpers, Donors and Volunteers!

It was a wonderful day out on the now beautiful Eel River. The weather was warm, the BBQ tri-tip from PG&E was great, and 80 hard working volunteers arrived to help. This section of the Eel is one of the jewels of Mendocino County, but it does need a yearly polishing.



We picked up an estimated 12-13 cubic yards of trash, over 1 cubic yard of recyclables, an old couch, a transmission, lead-acid batteries, a reclining chair and many bags filled with nasty cat litter. On Ridgeway Road, a crew had to use ropes to descend the steep cliff above the river to cleanup a huge can and bottle dump. Two cars were removed by tow truck. Inaccessible shoreline was cleaned by kayak. The recycle

crew sorted through all the bags of trash. Five miles of river and 25 miles of roads are now sparkling clean.



A few young volunteers found time to swim in the

clear, cool water while others mingled with friends and neighbors.

Overall it was a great day ! We got something done and we had a little fun, an accomplishment we can all feel good about. My heart felt thanks to each and every one of you who helped out in your own way. I hope you can make it again in October 2011.

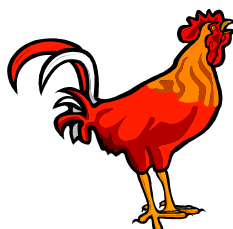
